



ADULT TAKE & MAKE Father's Day Cards

You will need:

- One full piece of cardstock (white or light colored)
- One half sheet of cardstock (colored or patterned)
- Glue stick
- Scissors

Step 1: Cut along the outline on the white piece of cardstock.

Step 2: Cut the two short lines under the top portion of the outline. These flaps are necessary to create the shirt's "collar."

Step 3: Fold the sides of the card inward along the score lines. One side will be wider than the other.



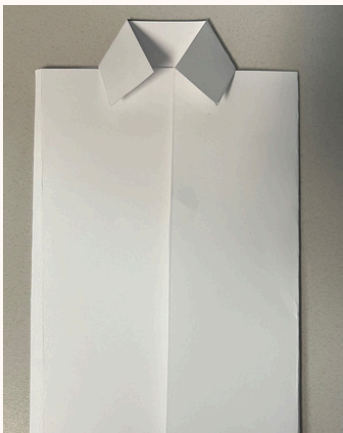

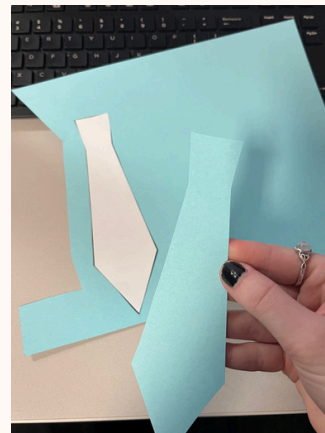

Step 4: Fold the collar down. Angle the collar flaps downwards and align the points so that it imitates a shirt collar, then press down on the fold.

Step 5: Use the tie template to trace the tie onto a colored or patterned piece of cardstock, then cut it out.

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Step 6: Before gluing the tie, line it up with the center of the collar to get an idea of where to glue it down. You will only be gluing half of the tie down onto the right fold of the card.

Step 7: Add glue along the edge of the right flap of the card (not the collar), then glue down your tie. Remember that you want your tie to be centered with the middle of the card, so only half the tie will be glued down.

Step 8: Open the card and write your Father's Day message!
