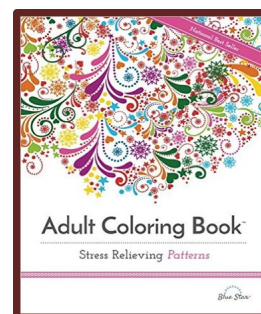

By E.J. James

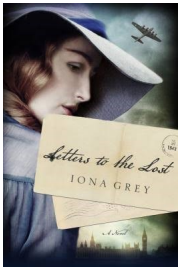

By Iona Grey

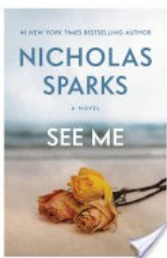

By Nicholas Sparks

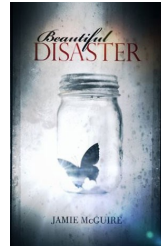

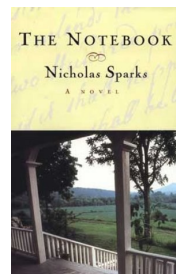

By Nicholas Sparks

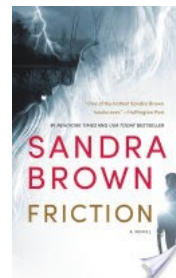

Rockin' Readers



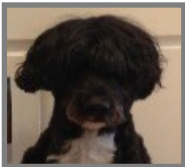
Saturdays, 11:30 – 12:00. No program on Feb. 13.

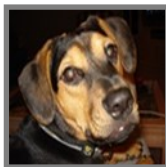

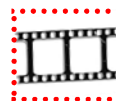
