Mother Goose on the Loose



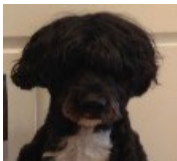

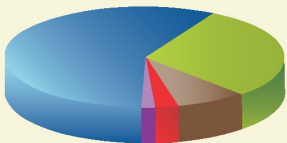

8% Ocean/Waterway Activities
2% Dumping Activities
