## St. Patrick's Day Fun Facts

#### 1. We Should Really Wear Blue

Saint Patrick himself would have to deal with pinching on his feast day. His color was "Saint Patrick's blue," a light shade. The color green only became associated with the big day after it was linked to the Irish independence movement in the late 18th century.

How did the shamrock become associated with Saint Patrick? According to Irish legend, the saint used the threeleafed plant as a metaphor for the Holy Trinity when he was first introducing Christianity to Ireland.
