Wednesday, January 23rd at 7pm Create a Vision Board with Renee Pokoj



Creating a vision board allows us to put our goals and dreams in a form for us to see daily. Visual reminders can be very helpful. Renee Pokoj from Organic Stepping Stones will talk briefly about "what is your vision?" along with how and why you should create a vision board. After the class, take home

your vision board and hang it in a place that you will see it daily. All supplies are provided. However, if you have a personal picture, quote, or something meaningful you want on your board, bring it!

Wednesday, January 16th at 7pm Opioid Awareness with Trooper Antonio Richardson

The opioid crisis is affecting people from all walks of life. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the number of fatal drug overdoses has never been higher in the United States than it is today. The majority of these overdoses involved opioids. Trooper Antonio Richardson will visit the library to discuss opioids, including prescription medication abuse, heroin, the MSP Angel Program, and opioid overdose reversal medications.

Tuesday, January 22nd at 7pm Cannabis for Pain Management with John Dale Merideth, Jr.

Researchers are continuing to explore how medical marijuana may benefit certain health conditions, including the alleviation of pain. John Merideth Jr, the president of CURE (Cannabis Used for Research and Education), will visit us to discuss options for patients using cannabis medicine to aid in pain management.
